#### CODE OF CONDUCT

All students must abide by the Rules and Standing Orders of the College. Violation of Rules and Standing Orders of the college or any misconduct inside and outside the College Campus or in Halls of Residence, will render a student liable to disciplinary action and may lead to expulsion from the college. At the time of admission, students will have to sign an undertaking to this effect and also to be endorsed by the guardians.

Further, if as a result of any demonstration or strike, any property of the College Campus or Halls of Residence is damaged, the cost of the same will be recovered directly from the students identified wherever possible or else collectively from such group of students as are responsible for the demonstration or strike.

#### Attendance and Examination

The strict observance of attendance and the examination sanctity has been a prime asset of the institute. Each student is required to secure atleast 75% attendance as per WBUT norms in both theory and practical classes. Failure to attain the required percentage debars a student for appearing in semester examinations.

#### **Examination Misconduct**

Any action which prejudices the integrity of the University Examinations shall be considered to be an academic misconduct and shall be punishable by appropriate disciplinary action. Academic Misconduct includes cheating in examinations, assignments, project or any other test used in judging students performance in the course of a programme of study. Impersonating another student or entering into agreement with another person to be impersonated is an act of examination misconduct.

#### Discipline

All students must abide by the rules and standing orders of the college, violation of which or any misconduct inside or outside the college campus may lead to disciplinary action as per the regulations and render a student liable to expulsion from the college. Students have to sign an undertaking to this effect for the above during admission. Further, if as a result of any demonstration or strike, any college property is damaged, the cost will be covered directly from the students who are identified or collectively from such group of students who are responsible for it. In case of non-identification of any student(s) mass fine shall be imposed thereon.

#### **Anti-Ragging Measures**

As per the latest amendment to UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009 [http://www.ugc.ac.in/page/Ragging-Related-Circulars.aspx] ragging is defined as "Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targetedat another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion,caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance,nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background."

Ragging in any form on any student inside or outside the college campus or hall of residence is strictly prohibited as per W.B. Govt. Anti-Ragging Act. Students found indulging in ragging shall be subject to strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the college. Supreme Court also has declared ragging as a nasty crime and advised for immediate serious action leading to even jail. The decision of the Principal and the anti-ragging committee regarding all matters on ragging based on the report of the anti-ragging committee will be final.

#### **Dress Code**

Proper dress code helps to bring a sense of discipline, sense of belonging and professional attitude leading to students' achieving a better edge in today's highly competitive job market.

The Institute strictly maintains its Dress Code and ID Card as compulsory for all students. Students not in prescribed uniform and/or not possessing a valid ID Card are liable to be debarred from entering the campus / attending classes. To maintain uniformity of colour and quality, the uniform has to be ordered from the authorized shop in Durgapur, duly approved by the college. Name of the shop will be given during admission. Please note that Dress Kit may be procured from outside as per College uniform sample.

For Boys: Grey Trousers with off-white (light cream) shirts with emblem emblazoned ties, black ties, black shoes with white socks. For Girls: Grey Skirt with off-white shirt with emblem emblazoned ties, black shoes with white socks. Grey Salwar (Churidar) with off-white (light cream) kameez for girls also may be allowed but is not encouraged. Winter Navy Blue Blazers from November to February for both boys and girls is compulsory. Girls students opting for Salwar-Kameez may wear navy blue cardigan during winter. Earmarked Tie and Metal Emblem will be supplied to each student by the college at a nominal cost during admission.

#### 1. Introduction:

- 1.1 The provisions of these regulations shall be effective for B.Tech/B.Pharm/B.Arch/B.OPTM/BHM degree programmes offered by institutions/colleges affiliated to the West Bengal University of Technology.
- 1.2 These regulations shall also be applicable to a new B.Tech Degree programme that may be of ted by institutions/colleges affiliated/to be affiliated to the West Bengal University of Technology, and also other first degree technology and four year Bachelor level programme started by the University through its affiliated institutions subsequently.
- 1.3 B.Tech / B.Pharm / B.Arch / B.OPTM / BHM Degree programme shall be offered in institutions/colleges affiliated to the West Bengal University of Technology in any of the following disciplines as per affiliation accorded by the University:

NOTICE

This is for information of all concerned that following guidelines are to be followed during Odd Semester Examination 2019.

- Odd Semester Examination 2019 will be conducted maintaining all the rules and regulations of the University Examination and the Roving Committee under the chairmanship of Director will oversee the smooth conducting of the examination, in addition to Exam Cell of the college. R egistrar and Campus Administrator will look after all the administrative work related to smooth conduct of the Semester Examination.
- 2) Exam Cell will provide necessary guidance to the Invigilators and the Roving Committee Members about the mechanism of conducting the exam as per guidelines of MAKAUT, to keep the sanctity of the University examination.
- 3) Exam Cell will be asked to provide seating arrangements to the Roving Committee so that Roving Committee will be aware about the numbers of the buildings, rooms, floors, etc. where the examinations will be held. The Roving Committee Members roam around the examination halls.
- 4) Campus Administrator is requested to provide extra security arrangement. At each entry and exit point security will be posted.
- 5) Collapsible gates/Shutters of the entry and exit points will be opened 15 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
- 6) Toilets will be checked and cleaned by the house-keeping staff before the commencement of the examination in both halves and additionally in each and every half an hour. Writing on the tables should also be cleaned before the commencement of the examination in both halves.
- 7) Examination rooms will be opened 15 minutes before the commencement of examination in presence of Invigilators and only then students will be allowed to enter in the examination hall. Security Personnel, under the guidance of Deputy Campus Administrator, will open the entries point/scheduled examination halls at 9-45 a.m. for the 1st half examination and will close the same at 1-15 p.m. Similarly, the entries point/scheduled examination halls will be opened at 1-45 p.m. and will be closed by 5-15 p.m.

8) Mobile in any mode (silent/switch off) or any other Bluetooth enabled devices inside the examination hall is banned during the Semester Examination of the University. Before entering into the Examination Halls, students are advised to keep mobile, bag, etc. outside the Examination Hall <u>exclusively on their own responsibility</u>.

Administration will not be liable in case of any loss/damage/theft of any device/material.

- 9) Students should bring their Registration Certificates, Admit Cards, foot rules, pencils, erasers, etc. only in the examination hall. Exchange of such items with other students is strictly prohibited.
- 10) Invigilators are requested to check the Admit Cards carefully so that defaulter students are not allowed to appear for the semester examination.
- 11) Students will not be allowed to enter the examination hall after 30 (Thirty) minutes of the scheduled time of commencement.
- 12) Students are to be allowed for 5 minutes for toilet purpose.
- 13) No student will be allowed to leave the examination hall before the expiry of an hour from the commencement of the examination.
- 14) In last 15 minutes of the examination before the final bell, no student will be allowed for going outside and rooms will be locked.

Invigilators should collect and count all the Answer Scripts in presence of the students and only then students should be allowed to leave the hall. In case lesser number of onswer Scripts is submitted before the Examination Department. Invigilators of the concerned examination hall will be liable.

- 15) Invigilators will report to the Roving Committee against malpractice/misconduct on the part of any student during the examination hour. If a student commits any offence first time, his/her answer script will be detained for 15 minutes and he will be warned. In case of second offence, answer script will be detained for 30 minutes and if thereafter the same student commits offence again, he/she will not be permitted to give the examination and the above misconduct will be reported to the Controller of Examination of MAKAUT.
- 16) Invigilators should come 30 (Thirty) minutes before the scheduled time of the examination.
- 17) Invigilators are advised not to use mobile phones (chatting & calling purposes) in the examination halls.
- 18) Faculty members are requested **not to interchange their invigilation duties.** Interchange of exam duties will be allowed in extreme emergent cases only with the permission of the Director.
- 19) Taking tea by the Invigilators at canteen during invigilation hour will not be allowed.
- 20) During the examination, no subject teacher is to be called by the Invigilator for any clarification raised by the student on question papers.
- 21) Invigilators should personally take the students' signature in the Students' Attendance Sheet. The Exam Cell should send the Students' Attendance Sheet as soon as possible after commencement of the examination.
- $\bigcirc$ :) Invigilation duties in the examination hall should be given by the faculty members in a befitting way irrespective of the semesters (1st, 3rd, 5th or 7th).
- 23) Sick students will be allowed to write the examination in the Medical Unit. They must submit proper medical papers to the Examination Cell beforehand. Exam Cell should provide faculty members as Invigilators in the Medical Unit.





The meeting of the Disciplinary Committee (DC) was convened to discuss the matter of making false statement and consequent leaving hostel at odd hours by some hostel boarders.

- 1. Proctor informed the committee members that on the night of 15<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 around 8.00 pm following five students pressurized the hostel warden to allow them to leave for the home. They also made entries in the hostel out-going register accordingly.
  - i. Shubham Saurav of CE 2<sup>nd</sup> year(Roll No. 1619030
  - i. Sagar Verma of ECE 2<sup>nd</sup> year (Roll No. 1605083)
  - iii. Prince Kumar of ECE 2<sup>nd</sup> year (Roll No. 1605084)
  - iv. Akash Kumar Rao of EE 2<sup>nd</sup> year (Roll No. 1607032
  - v. Roshan Kumar Jha of ME 2<sup>nd</sup> year (Roll No. 1602016)

Proctor further informed that on enquiry, it came into surface that they neither reached home nor came back to the hostel. It came to light that they had got some friends' Scorpio Suv as transport and departed, the destination unknown.

It was pointed out by the Proctor that Shubham Saurav was involved in intoxication case earlier wherein he was exonerated by the DC considering his first-time offence and his parents was requested to meet the college authorities; unfortunately he did not turn up yet.

- 2. Disciplinary Committee of the college discussed the matter and decided that any kind of indisciplined act in the hostel will not be tolerated and imposed the following punishment as per rules of the college:
  - i) Expulsion from the hostel forthwith
  - ii) A fine of Rs 25000/-
