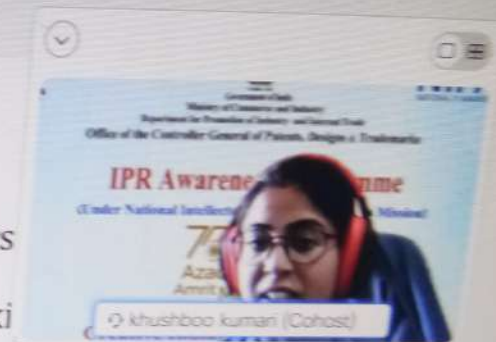

WHAT IS PATENT

- Patent is a grant by **sovereign or state** to a person giving **exclusive right** to stop others from “making, exercising, vending and importing”
AN INVENTION FOR A LIMITED PERIOD,
IN EXCHANGE FOR DISCLOSING IT IN A PATENT SPECIFICATION *such that any one having average skill in the art can reproduce the invention.*
- Right to exclude others from using your invention
- Owner has a qualified right to use the invention
